Activities

d) GIAHS

FAO has upgraded the research project dedicated to Globally Important Agricultural Heritage Systems (GIAHS) to the status of "program". A new Scientific Advisory Group has been created and a revision of the criteria will take place. One of the FAO goals is to extend GIAHS to the European Continent and other developed countries. Agreements are going to be taken also with the UNESCO World Heritage Convention concerning rural landscapes.

As you know, EUCALAND had from the early beginning the objective to cooperate with the GIAHS program. For several reasons we haven't been able to conduct this cooperation but maybe it is worth to do a new effort? Who is already in contact with partners of the GIAHS initiative or who would be willing to establish a light cooperation?

Le colline del Soave sono un paesaggio storico caratterizzato dalla coltura della vite che affonda le sue radici nel periodo romano, la cui matrice viticola giunge a completa maturazione nel periodo ottocentesco. L'area possiede anche notevoli valori estetici e panoramici, soprattutto in relazione alla avanzata della urbanizzazione nella pianura che si estende a sud dell'area collinare.

Indicators on the quality of rural landscape, Italy

The National Observatory for Rural Landscape, established at the Ministry of Agriculture, Food and Forestry Policies, together with Italian National Statistical Agency (ISTAT) and the Laboratory for Landscape and Cultural Heritage of the University of Florence, School of Agriculture, have developed indicators on the quality of rural landscape. These indicators contributed to the production of the ISTAT Annual Report on the Quality of Life of the Italian population. It is an innovation resulting from the introduction of the landscape in the National Plan for Rural Development. The conservation of historical features of the rural landscape is one of the indicators adopted.

The first meeting for the presentation of such indicators was held in Florence on 1st March 2016.

The first layer of a land use system covering 120 sites located in all the Italian regions has been completed. This layer, with a resolution of 500 m², represents the first step in the development of a monitoring system dedicated to the landscape for the Italian territory.

Call for papers

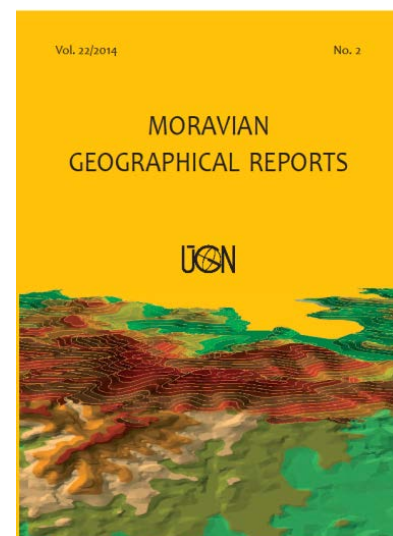
Moravian Geographical Reports (MGR) announced the call for papers for a Special Issue on Urban agriculture: New trends and challenges in the context of Europe.

It has been included in the SCOPUS database (since 1993) and in the ISI WEB of Knowledge database (since 2012). The planned Special Issue of MGR would like to resume the issue of urban agriculture and investigate and discuss it from a geographical perspective and in a wider context of the urban space transformation and renewal and the agricultural restructuring and multifunctionality. The aim of the Special Issue is to cover and evaluate the current state-of-the-art in the research conducted in many European countries in this field. Papers analysing the development of urban agriculture from a spatial perspective, mapping the current trends and challenges, and comparative studies covering more regions are welcome. A contribution of urban agriculture to the sustainable urban development, multifunctional or edible landscapes and green infrastructures, and to actual current societal challenges is especially welcome.
